Take home messages-suicide

- 2010-2019
 - WA suicide rate has been <u>higher</u> than the national rate for more than 10 years.
- 2014-2019
 - **Education:** Among people 18 years and older, the suicide rate was highest in those with <u>9th to 12th grade (no diploma) and high school graduates (including equivalency).</u>
- **2020*** compared to 2019
 - **Overall:** There was no increase in suicides.
 - **Race/ethnicity:** There was an increase among Hispanics.
 - Age group: The largest <u>decrease was in people 65 years and older and 45-64 years of age.</u>
 - **Sex:** There was no increase.
 - Most common means: There was a decrease in all three of the common means.
 - Education: There was an increase among people with some college no degree and people with less then 9th grade.

*2020 death data are preliminary, as of 4/5/2021. 2020 suicide numbers are expected to change before the data are finalized.
