Fundamentals

<u>Partnership & Leadership</u> Multi-sector,

transdisciplinary partnership that includes diverse parent voices from lived experiences, working toward statewide collective impact .

<u>Social Norms</u> Furthering of community and family norms that support parent and child resiliency and positive parenting.

<u>Shared Policy Agenda</u> Creating context for healthy families and children.

<u>Strategies</u> Using strength-based, shared risk and protective factor model, and science-informed strategies.

Data & Measurement to Inform Actions & Solutions

Improving data sharing and use across systems along with a continual assessment of process and outcomes.

2020-2021 Priority Strategies and Actions

Child and Family Systems & Supports

- Promote expansion of early childhood home visiting programs for families with young children
- Advance behavioral health promotion and family friendly treatment efforts
- Expand research-informed parenting skill, support, and knowledge efforts

Community Capacity Building

- Expand systems like Help Me Grow that link families efficiently with best-fit resources in communities
- Anchor systems with central, statewide supports
- Enhance parent and caregiver voice in leadership and decision making

System Development

- Set policy agenda and inform policy reform efforts that are directly informed by communities and families
- Promote policy and system changes that strengthen economic security
- Grow social norms that support positive parenting and enhance child health

Increase economic security

Measures: National Survey of Child Health (NSCH), societal income inequality Gini Index, American Community Survey

Increase social norms that support positive parenting and child health

Measures: CDC Washington social norms survey, Healthy Youth Survey, NSCH

Improve parent-child relationships

Measures: National Survey of Children, Healthy Youth Survey, K Readiness (OSPI), Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey (BRFSS), Help Me Grow and other partner measures
