MEDICALLY VERIFIED IMMUNIZATION RECORDS

School and Child Care Staff Guide

All immunization records turned in to schools or child care centers are required by law to be medically verified. A medically verified Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) form is a:

- CIS printed by a health care provider or school from the Washington State Immunization Information System (WAIIS).
 - Health care providers update immunization records in the WAIIS, which means the form counts as medically verified.
- CIS printed from MyIR Mobile.
 - MyIR is a free online tool from the Washington State Department of Health (DOH) which allows families to view and print their official immunization records themselves. These print-outs come from the WAIIS, which makes it medically verified. People can register for MyIR Mobile at <u>https://myirmobile.com/register/</u>. After clicking on the button for Washington state, people can select between English and Spanish languages.
- The most recent version of a printed CIS completed by hand.
 - A hand-filled CIS must be verified with a health care provider signature, or medical records must be attached so staff can verify the CIS for accuracy.
