What is hepatitis A and who's at risk?

Hepatitis A is a liver infection caused by the hepatitis A virus. It is very contagious.

People who are or were recently in jail or prison are at risk of getting hepatitis A. The virus is spreading from person to person and causing outbreaks around the country.

If you are or were recently in jail or prison, protect yourself and others from hepatitis A

Get vaccinated The vaccine is safe and effective.
