Pharmacist is responsible for establishing policies for storing, compounding, delivering, dispensing and recordkeeping in regard to medication within appropriate state and federal regulations.

Patient Care Services: WAC 246-330-205

Provide appropriate personnel, space, equipment, reference materials, training, and supplies for the appropriate care and treatment of patients

- Construction review standards (American Institute of Architects, NFPA, etc.)
- Staffing ratios
- CDC standards
- Maintenance standards
- Manufacturer's instructions for use

Physical and chemical restraints, consistent with CFR 42.482

Surgical Services: WAC 246-330-210

Use policies and procedures to define standards of care

- Lots of options. Could refer to national standard. Must be justified

Anesthesia Services: WAC 246-330-215

Use policies and procedures to define standards of care

- Lots of options. Could refer to national standard. Must be justified

Emergency Services: WAC 246-330-225

Onsite equipment, medication and trained personnel to manage any emergency that may arise from the services provided or sought

- Standards of practice
- Identification and methods to address known risks (e.g. malignant hyperthermia)

Management of Environment of Care: WAC 246-330-230

Safe control of hazardous materials and waste

- Federal state and local regulations (MSDS, NFPA, Construction Review Services)

Reporting of incidents (spills, etc.)

- Federal state and local regulations

Emergency preparedness

- Facility-specific risk assessment and coordination with local emergency management

Medical Equipment operation and maintenance

- In accordance manufacturer's directions for use
- FDA, CDC (multiple references)

Physical Environment

- State plumbing code WAC 51-56-003
