## Washington State Approved 16-Hour EMR Refresher Course Schedule



#### Introduction:

### Guidance:

- This 16-hour EMR refresher course will meet hours of the education requirements for Washington State continuing medical education (CME) recertification requirements <u>WAC 246-976-162</u> for EMRs who do not meet ongoing training and evaluation program (OTEP) requirements listed in <u>WAC 246-976-163</u>.
- This 16-hour refresher course will meet the national and state content education requirements for <u>National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) recertification</u> via the National Continued Competency Program (NCCP) model (it does include four required individual NCCP content hours).
- This 16-hour refresher course will meet the education requirements for state-approved refresher courses required for <u>lapsed NREMT certifications</u>.
- When using this template for EMRs who need retraining based on <u>WAC 246-976-141</u>, state and local content hours may be modified to meet the hourly requirement listed in WAC.
- Local and state content should be taken from the current <u>National Model EMS Clinical Guidelines</u>, <u>National EMS Education Standards</u>, <u>NREMT NCCP EMR Training Guide</u>, <u>Washington State Approved</u> <u>Procedures and Skills for Certified EMS Providers</u>, nationally recognized training programs, and local state and medical program director-approved protocols.
- All skills must be performed in person and evaluated by a state-approved EMS evaluator.
- Pediatric topics are to be included in airway-respiratory-ventilation, cardiovascular, medical-pharmacology, trauma, and operations topics.
- Education can be gathered through Distributive Education (online) or in-person courses. There are no limits on how much Distributive Education (DE) is utilized.
- Distributive education is defined as instruction where students and instructor do not interact in real time
- If this course is taken for part of the education requirements for Washington EMT recertification per WAC 246-976-162, CME method, providers will still need to pass the Washington cognitive assessment examination through NREMT/Pearson Vue.
- This document will be updated at a minimum of every four years and as needed to align with the NREMT NCCP training guide, or as needed to align with other national or Washington State requirements.

- NREMT determines national content topics.
- Specific information related to the instruction of these topics should be taken from the NCCP document, which is on the NREMT website. Which provides instructor preparations, lesson objectives, and lesson content.
- National content includes eight hours of education; NREMT allows all those hours to be distributive.
- All skills must be performed in person and evaluated by a state-approved EMS evaluator.
- NREMT requires a minimum of 10% of hours to be pediatric.

- State and local content includes four hours of education; NREMT allows all those hours to be distributive.
- Individual content of four hours is required for NREMT recertification. Because of the content and length of this course, individual content hours are to be included. All hours may be distributive.
