# **Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP)**

### **Program Overview**

Washington's Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) was established in 2007 under <u>RCW 70.225</u> to improve patient care and prevent prescription drug misuse. The program collects dispensing records for **Schedule II, III, IV and V controlled substances**, and makes this information available to medical providers and pharmacists as a clinical decision-making tool. Program rules (<u>WAC 246-470</u>) took effect **August 27, 2011**.

#### Why It's Important

- Informs prescribing decisions-and enhances patient care and reduces the risk of prescription drug misuse
- Supports Washington's broader strategy to reduce opioid overdoses

#### How to Access the PMP

- Via Secure Access Washington (SAW): Create a SAW account to log in to:

- Via Electronic Health Record (EHR) integration: Available through state-approved methods (see below)

### Who Can Access PMP Data

Access is granted under **<u>RCW 70.225</u>** and <u>**WAC 246-470**</u> to the following:

- Prescribers and pharmacists providing care to patients
- Patients (for access to their own prescription data)
- Facilities licensed by the Department of Health
- Washington State Hospital Association
   Coordinated Quality Improvement Program
- Local health officers (medical officers with local jurisdictions)
- Health profession licensing boards
- Law enforcement and prosecutorial officials (for specific, bona fide investigations)

- Medical examiners and coroners (for determining cause of death)
- Health Care Authority (for Medicaid recipients)
- **Department of Labor and Industries** (for workers' compensation cases)
- **Department of Corrections** (for individuals in custody)
- **Public and private organizations** (for de-identified data used in research, educational, or statistical analysis)

### **EHR Integration Mandate**

Under <u>Substitute Senate Bill 5380</u> (2019), facilities, offices, or provider groups with 10 or more prescribers – excluding critical access hospitals – must demonstrate EHR integration with the PMP (<u>RCW 70.225.090</u>). A waiver process is available for those unable to comply. Integration options include:

- OneHealthPort (OHP): Washington's Health Information Exchange
- Direct integration: Through approved vendors, such as Bamboo Health's PMP Gateway (formerly Appriss Health)



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# How to Request PMP Data

- **Patients:** May request a report from their prescriber or pharmacist or follow the steps in <u>WAC 246-470-040</u> to request it from the state.
- Legal Requests: Submit to PrescriptionMonitoring@doh.wa.gov. Must include a court order or grand jury subpoena
  as outlined in <u>RCW 70.225.040</u>.
- Law Enforcement/Medical Examiners/Prosecutors: May request access under <u>RCW 70.225.040</u> following <u>WAC</u> <u>246-470-060</u>.
- De-identified Data Requests (Research/Education): Submit a request here.
