FAMILY HEALTH CENTERS PROFILE 2022

Family Health Centers receives funding devoted solely to sexual and reproductive health and related preventive health services with a focus on low-income and uninsured persons. Funds support services such as breast and pelvic exams, Pap smears and other cancer screenings, STI/HIV testing, pregnancy testing and counseling, and affordable birth control, including long-acting reversible contraception (LARC). Family Health Centers works with Washington State Department of Health to assure quality and affordable sexual and reproductive health services at its clinics in Okanogan County.

In 2022, Family Health Centers served 1065 clients during 1,437 clinic visits, representing a 7% increase in clients and an 12% increase in clinic visits from 2021. An estimated 73% of female clients of reproductive age served in 2022 were on some form of contraceptive method resulting in a lower risk of unintended pregnancy, unplanned births, and abortions.

Sexual & reproductive services provided by Family Health Centers prevented an estimated* 140 unintended pregnancies and 50 abortions, and saved over \$750k in health care costs in 2022 alone

Family Health Centers' family planning services averted unwanted reproductive health outcomes and saved healthcare-related expenses by providing contraceptive services, testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections, and vaccination against HPV to prevent cervical cancer. Most notably, in 2022 the agency's services prevented an estimated 140 unintended pregnancies, 70 unplanned births, and 50 abortions resulting in net savings of over \$750,000 associated with maternal and birth-related care, miscarriages, ectopic pregnancies, and abortions averted.
