

Newborn Screening Fee

In Washington State, the fee for newborn screening is \$119.30. This one-time fee covers the initial and any additional newborn screens performed by the State Newborn Screening Program. Most babies are screened twice—once after birth and again when the baby is 7-14 days old.

The Department of Health will bill your health insurance directly for first screens collected in a home setting. Please help your midwife complete the Payment Form and send it with your baby's screen. If you do not have health insurance, include a check or money order.

The booklet "Newborn Screening: Important Information about Newborn Screening for Parents in Washington State" has more information about the importance of newborn screening.

Congratulations to you and your new baby!

Note: Insurance reimbursement rates depend on your health insurance plan. If your insurance does not cover the entire cost of screening, you may be billed for the balance.
