




Family Issuance Day (FID)



The **Family Issuance Day (FID)** is the day of the month Cascades sets as the First Date to Spend for the family's food benefit issuance cycle.


System Defined FID

- Cascades sets the System Defined FID when staff certify the first participant in the family.
- All participants in the family have the same issuance day.
- Cascades <u>prorates</u> food benefits for a new participant in the family when needed to align their benefits with the Family Issuance Day.
 The new participant receives full food benefits for future months.



Custom FID

- Staff may change the Family Issuance Day to a Custom date when needed.
- Press the pencil icon on the Issue Food Instruments screen in the Configuration container (see above) to open the Family Issuance Day Configuration pop-up and change the FID to a custom date.



Change the Family Issuance Day

Staff can change the Family Issuance Day when there are no current or future benefits issued for any participant in the family. Staff may choose to do this when the family has a gap in benefits to "re-set" the issuance day and not prorate benefits.

Look for all green dots above each participant icon in the Family Carousel which means no current or future benefits are issued.








Proration

Proration is the practice of reducing the amount of some foods a participant receives depending on how many days remain before the next Family Issuance Day (how many days remain in the benefit issuance cycle). The intent is to issue the appropriate amount of WIC foods for the time remaining in the family's benefit cycle.

- Cascades only prorates benefits for one month and issues the full food package for the following months.
- Cascades displays prorated benefits on the Issue Food Instruments screen.



Washington WIC uses ¼ proration

Cascades decreases some food benefits by about ¼ based on the number of days remaining between the First Date to Spend and the Last Date to Spend as shown below.

Number of Days between First Date to Spend and Last Date to Spend	Food Package Size
24 - 31	Full package
16 - 23	¾ package
8 - 15	½ package
1 - 7	¼ package

- For months that are 30 31 days, Cascades will prorate benefits 6 or 7 days after the FID because of the longer benefit issuance cycle.
- February has a shorter issuance cycle and Cascades prorates benefits sooner, sometimes 5 days after the FID.

The <u>Proration Examples</u> show prorated food benefits for each participant category.

Talking about food benefit proration

Here's an example of how to talk about proration with participants:

"The amount of benefits our system issues depends on how many days remain before your next Family Issuance Day. If you receive benefits later than your Family Issuance Day our system may reduce some of the foods. The amount goes back to normal for the next month. Because of this we'll try to schedule your appointments around the same time every month."

Another concept or key phrase to use when talking about proration:

"All the days of your food benefit cycle are covered."





Proration Examples

Information:

- Since most participants want 1 pound of cheese as part of their food prescription, the Cascades default food prescriptions include 1 pound of cheese substituted for .75 gallons of milk. These examples use the default food prescription with 1 pound of cheese substituted for .75 gallon of milk.
- No other tailoring is included in these examples. If foods are substituted, like yogurt for milk, it would affect the milk amounts.

Proration Examples

- Infant formula proration applies when changing from no formula to any formula.
- Proration doesn't apply when the infant received some formula and the amount is increasing or the formula type changes.
